


Ancestry.com Resources Free to New Yorkers



Portions of Ancestry.com pertaining to New York are free to New York State residents! The New York State Archives has partnered with Ancestry to digitize some NY state records of interest to genealogists. The resulting <u>databases</u> are free to use if you live in New York State. http://www.archives.nysed.gov/research/res ancestry.shtml


Some local libraries—including both branches of the Poughkeepsie Public Library District—also subscribe to the more comprehensive "Library Edition" of Ancestry.com. Drop by and check it out! (Off-site use of the "Library Edition" is only for City/Town of Poughkeepsie residents)







Once you've clicked on any of the results links, a box like the one below will open, allowing you to sign up for free access to only the designated New York State resources. (proceed the way described; do not click on the 'subscribe' link unless you want a paid subscription—and the 14-day trial will give you access to the complete Ancestry.com databases, but only for a fortnight...) You can adjust your e-mail settings after creating the account.



Because you will use this version of Ancestry.com (New York) as an individual, the "Family Tree" function-not available to "Library Edition" users—is available for
