The Poetry of Place: Native American Place Names in Ulster County

Join us for an educational and fun-filled evening as Professor Evan Pritchard, author and a descendant of the Algonquin-speaking people, will present an illustrated lecture where he will discuss the various layers of poetic meaning in the Native American place names in Ulster County. We'll see how Algonquin place names tended towards clever wordplay and purposeful ambiguity, some more like poems than sentences. We'll learn how the Dutch joined in the process and reshaped these words to have a similar sound and meaning, but in Dutch. New York is the only place where one finds these "Double Dutched" place names, literary time capsules for those who want to understand the ancient history of our region. A reception will follow the talk.
